# This is the Last Will and Testament

of me Thomas Beagley of Alton in the County of Northampton Thriftlayer as follows  
that is to say first I direct all my just debts funeral expenses and the charges of proving this  
my will to be fully paid and satisfied by my Executors hereinafter named as soon as or as  
conveniently can be after my decease and I bequeath the use and enjoyment of all my  
household furniture and effects unto my dear wife Mary Ann for and during the term of her  
natural life provided she remains my widow and from and after her decease or second  
marriage then I give and bequeath the same or such of them or such part thereof as or  
shall not have been heretofore consumed worn out or exhausted unto and between all my  
children living at her decease or second marriage equally to be divided among by my  
Executors and I give devise and bequeath unto my brother James Beagley of Alton above  
Thriftlayer and my friends Benjamin Bellier of the same place Cooper and James Coates  
of the same place either whom I appoint joint Executors and trustees of this my will and  
to the survivors and survivor of them and that their Executors administrators and assigns  
of such survivor all that my half share or interest of and in the freehold estate situate  
lying and being at Deberton in the said County of Northampton to which I am entitled  
under the will of Mrs Ann Drobby deceased and also all my estate right title and interest  
in and to certain leasehold dwellinghouses and premises situate in Dapwood Street postman  
square and belknap Street Mile End in the County of Middlesex to which I am also entitled  
under the same will in right of Ann Drobby my late wife and also all other my  
estate and interest to which I am now or hereafter may become entitled either in right  
of the said Ann Drobby my late wife or in my own right under the said will and all  
other my estate and effects whatsoever and whosoever both real and personal upon a  
trust to pay the yearly rents issues and profits thereof as the same shall be received or come  
to the said Ann (after deducting the necessary outgoings in respect thereof) unto my said  
wife Mary Ann for and during the term of her natural life if she shall so long continue  
my widow for the maintenance of herself and my four children namely Edward James  
Charles and George Beagley equally but if my said wife Mary Ann shall marry again  
then immediately upon and after such her second marriage or her death which may  
first happen I do hereby direct my said Executors and trustees and the survivors or survivor  
of them or the their Executors or administrators of such survivor to make sale and a  
disposal of my said freehold leasehold and other estates and property either by public or  
private sale as they shall think most advantageous and out of the monies  
arising by or from such sale pay unto my said wife Mary Ann in the event of her  
said marriage instead of the rents and profits thereof howsoever due to be paid to her  
the sum of fifty pounds which I do hereby bequeath to her in lieu thereof and in bar of  
all dower which she may claim in the said freehold estate or in any other part  
of the property I am here disposed of and upon further trust that they my said Executors  
and trustees or the survivors or survivor of them or the Executors or administrators of such  
survivor shall and do lay out and invest the residue of the monies to arise by sale of  
my said freehold and leasehold estates and premises or the residue thereof as the same may  
happen in real or government securities in England (with power to alter change or vary  
the same for other securities of the like nature as they shall think most beneficial) and  
pay and apply the interest dividends and annual produce thereof from time to time  
during the respective minorities of all and every my said children whether now  
or hereafter to be born who shall be living at the time of my decease or before in such  
time afterwards for and towards their respective maintenance education support and  
benefit in equal proportions share and share alike if more than one and if but one then  
to pay and apply the whole of such interest dividends and annual produce for and  
towards the maintenance education support and benefit of such only child at the direction  
of them my said Executors and Trustees and from and immediately after all and every
